

For the first time in our 40 years of ministry, I've had to step back and seriously think about our future and how we can continue to serve the needs of the poor and wounded among us. I profoundly trust in Providence. I am confident if God wants us to continue that we will find our way. I am also profoundly aware that so many of you who support us year in and year out are struggling to manage but you still contribute. I am forever grateful for the sacrifices you make so that we might help others in need.

Even though these have been very difficult days, I continue to see countless miracles of hope and transformation. I continue to witness firsthand so many of the men that live at Hope Academy reclaim their lives and become productive members of our larger community. I have seen fractured families healed, broken marriages made whole, and men who felt they had no purpose discover a life that is meaningful and life-giving.

Recently I heard a graduate share his story. In the midst of all this craziness, it just renewed my hope. He talked about coming here as an alternative to jail and not really wanting to be here. He acknowledged how he really hurt the loving family that gave him life and how when he first arrived had

no hope. He completed the program. After graduation, because of his successfulness and transformation, he was offered a job with us. As part of this story, he talked about the healing in his family and how much it meant to be a son again and a big brother to his sisters. And, how touched he was to dance with his sister at her wedding and recently being asked to be the godfather of her daughter. He said his gratitude was beyond words. He never thought he would regain what he lost and spends every day attempting to give back and show gratitude.

This man is who he is today because of the many hands and hearts that bless our ministry every day and have for 40 years. These are difficult times for all of us, but I am cautiously optimistic that we will manage and hopefully become stronger and more attentive to the needs of others.

Thanksgiving is a time not only to be grateful but to show gratitude. I am profoundly grateful to all of you who have walked this journey with me for 40 years. I am grateful to Charlie Russo, our Chairman of the Board, who has been a companion on this journey for 40 years. I'm grateful to all of our Executive Board members, Advisory Board members, and the thousands of people who sacrifice some of their treasure every day so that others might reclaim their lives.

As we all prepare for the holiday season, let us remember the reason for the season. It is a time for renewed hope, a time for love and compassion, and for building bridges and not walls. It is the time for social justice and peace and treating all of God's people with dignity and respect.

Thanksgiving and Christmas blessings! Be assured that all of you are in my prayers every day and that I am forever grateful for all that you've contributed to this ministry of healing, hope and human transformation.

In Loving Memory of Our Hometown Hero Christopher Pendergast

"On the morning of October 14, a local hero went home to his God after a courageous life living with ALS, having spent his life working for a cure and supporting others who have been burdened with this incurable disease.

Dr. Christopher Pendergast, a retired Northport School District science teacher from Miller Place had lived with ALS for more than 28 years -- a real light in the darkness. He had been a tireless advocate for research regarding finding a cure. His public advocacy is legendary.

However, what people did not know was the thousands of people across three decades that Chris touched with his selfless compassion, love and empathy. If he knew you were diagnosed with ALS, he and his wife Christine would quietly reach out to offer support.

In 1997 Chris founded the Ride for Life which touched thousands of students and people all over Long Island. He was a prolific writer and a powerful and moving public speaker.

On the Sunday before he died, Chris came with his wife Christine to the 12 noon Mass at St. Louis de Montfort Church in Sound Beach. That was his Mass – he went every Sunday until very recently. He and his wife were catechists who prepared young people from the parish for confirmation.

At the amen, they gave him a standing ovation as a way of saying thank you. On Wednesday, October 14, he peacefully went home to God. St. Joseph's College Helps Hope House Ministries



HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL SEGOND CHANGE BOUTIQUE!

In 2013, Fr. Frank approached long time HHM supporters Barbara and Artie Morin with an idea. What if a retail space could generate needed funds for Little Portion Friary, home of 65 young men in recovery from drug and alcohol addiction? Its proceeds could pay for their college classes, food, utilities and transportation costs.

In August of 2019, Barbara and Artie, with help from above, found the perfect location for their store at 19 Chereb Lane, Port Jefferson Station, right next to the Port Jeff Bowl. They began collecting donations and held a yard sale to acquire "seed money" for the many renovations needed for the store including cleaning, painting, carpentry, plumbing and electric. All of the labor was accomplished with the talents of the young men at Little Portion Friary.

Because Hope House Ministries is all about second chances, we named the store HOPE SPRINGS ETERNAL SECOND CHANCE BOUTIQUE.

Our hope is to be able to raise \$150,000 annually to support the agency and those in recovery. We only accept new or very gently used items at the store. And everything is cleaned and prepared for sale by a team of dedicated volunteers. Our Facebook page highlights our most recent items and Facebook Marketplace has become a great way for customers to connect with our store and mission.

God bless the work of Fr. Frank and his staff at Hope House Ministries! And God bless the young men at the Little Portion Friary residential care facility for their courage to change!

I've got both good news and bad news to share.

The good news is so many of you responded generously to our 40th Anniversary Initiative. We announced our plan to raise \$2 million dollars last spring in order to create a sustainability

fund, an operational reserve and a mortgage payoff. To date, we have raised \$1,328,883 toward that end. This is truly wonderful news!

Things got started when an anonymous donor from the Port Jeff community made a lead gift of \$250,000 toward our match. This was followed by 34 individuals and businesses who pledged \$25,000 or more resulting in \$845,000. In addition, there have been countless individuals who have made gifts at the \$10, \$25, \$40, \$100, \$500 and \$1,000 levels. The response has been overwhelming! With 6 months remaining to reach our goal, we are trusting in Divine Providence to help us cross the finish line.

And now the bad news. We all know the entire world shut down last March. The impact has been hard to describe. In a normal year for Hope House, our events raise roughly \$1.1 million dollars in revenue. Little did we know that the funds we are now raising would become so critical to our survival during the shutdown. As you know, all of our events were either cancelled, postponed or modified.

At this point we can honestly say, that if it weren't for your generosity we would be closing programs right now. Which is why words simply fail to capture our debt to each and every one of you. From all of us, a mighty thank you!

As we prepare for 2021, our budget forecasts warn of significant revenue shortfalls. Not only are we charged with finding new ways to raise dollars in lieu of events, but every year we raise additional dollars on top of event revenue to cover program costs.

In short, we are prepared to close or dramatically scale back some of our programs in light of the Covid-19 shutdown. The Board of Directors are looking very carefully at what our new configuration may look like. Thankfully we have a CEO and Founder who believes in the power of Hope. He is committed to serving as many people in need as we are capable. You would be amazed to learn how many people continue to reach out for assistance, now more than ever, and still receive professional services from our dedicated staff in spite of the challenges.

Major Gift Challenge:

The HHM Board of Directors continues to seek individuals and/or business entities to join them in making lead gifts of \$25,000. One-time lead gifts of \$25,000, five-year pledges of \$5,000, or an amount that makes sense to you will move us all the more closer to our goal.

\$40.00 for 40 Years Challenge:

Many of you continue to send in donations of \$40. So far this effort has resulted in nearly \$59,000. Thank you! Thank you! Thank you!

\$40,000 GoFundMe Challenge

Our online community has raised \$17,168 toward our GoFundMe goal of \$40,000. With the introduction of our newly renovated website, we hope to reach a wider audience and reach this goal by the end of the year.
