

A Message from Fr. Frank

Dear Friends and Benefactors:

On Wednesday, May 10, 2023, in the early afternoon, a local icon died of a massive heart attack at the age of 51; his wife found him sitting in his office chair. A local EMS worker who

lives down the street came running and tried to revive him. He had already passed; I arrived just after he was pronounced.

Matthew "Matt" LoNigro left his lovely wife Julia, a local tenured schoolteacher and two extraordinary children: Matthew Jr., 20, and Abigail, a 16-year-old student at Miller Place High School. Matt was very actively involved in the Miller Place school district as the dynamic director of the Miller Place Boys Lacrosse.

Lacrosse was one of his many passions. For many years, he was actively involved on the Board of Directors for Suffolk County PAL Lacrosse. During his early career, he was actively involved with Port Jefferson Sporting Goods, a family business. He was a salesman for school districts seeking sports equipment and sports uniforms. He was such a dynamic salesman; he probably could've sold the Pope the Brooklyn Bridge.

Matt spent most of his adult life doing for others. He was actively involved with Christmas Magic, Backpack Pirates and countless other activities that reached out to the disadvantaged in our larger community. If somebody was in trouble and needed good advice and/or a helping hand,

Matthew was the go-to guy. He was a tremendous mentor for young athletes who wanted to be lacrosse players.

We have lost a powerful example of what community and reaching out to others is


> are crazy times. We need more people with Matt's passion and commitment to helping others, with the purpose of giving back. His heart and random acts of



A few years ago, a childhood friendship and a chance encounter turned into fundraising events to benefit Hope House. Karen Sullivan, a local Certified Functional Medicine Health Coach, and an avid supporter of Hope House, was approached by her childhood friend Gena Rovira who is the Divisional Sales Manager of On-Line Business at Halstead/Metroflor. and a team at Halstead/Metroflor were tasked to raise money for agencies that help people recover from Substance Use Disorder. The 3rd Annual 48 Mile Run for Hope was held March 3-5th, 2023. The Run was organized & inspired by Ronan O'Brien & David Giaccone who completed the 4x4x48 in 2021 for the first time. In 2022 six gentlemen completed 32 MILES! This year we had 12 Hope House alumni & residents step to the plate for the challenge, which

had participants run 4 miles every 4 hours for 48 hours. Supporters made a per mile pledge with 100% of the proceeds funding alcohol & substance abuse treatment & many other human services provided by Hope House Ministries.

Founding Inspiration: Ronan was first introduced to David Goggin's via the internet and learned about his amazing journey of hardship, dedication, transformation, and inspiration. The power of his message is undeniable. We encourage everyone to look him up and read his book **Can't Hurt Me** — We were blown away. Some of the obstacles he overcame include an abusive childhood, a learning disability, racism, and obesity. He eventually became a decorated Navy

Seal, extreme endurance athlete, top motivational speaker for pro-athletes and business moguls, and someone who has PERSONALLY raised millions for various charities.

He has inspired us to be super-vigilant in maintaining a healthy body, mind, and spirit. Part of that involves doing things that are uncomfortable and stepping outside of our comfort zones to *discover what we are truly capable of*. That is what this 4x4x48 Challenge represents for us and that is also what Hope House has meant for us. We are NOT endurance athletes by any stretch of the imagination! It was a monumental CHALLENGE no doubt, but for a great cause in Hope House Ministries to which we can personally attest to the MIRACLES they provide every day!

As David has noted and Father Frank touches on often in his homilies: "In a time when there is so much divisiveness, this event is a rare opportunity to come together with people all over the world for some amazing causes!"

The Community House

Since its founding in 1980, the Community House with 10 beds has grown to a 30-bed house that provides a compassionate approach to crisis intervention and a residential community for homeless young people in need. The program serves primarily youth between the ages of 16 and 21 years. It offers a creative living space where a young person can grow and develop.

Hope Academy at Little Portion Friary

A long-term non-traditional residential treatment program for addiction (minimum 12-18 months).

Pax Christi Hospitality Center

This twenty-five bed emergency center for men over 16, provides those in need on Long Island a compassionate, temporary residence offering three components: shelter and food, human needs and services, advocacy and networking.

Project Hope

Project Hope, under the aegis of the Pax Christi Hospitality Center, is a program specifically designed to serve those considered to be chronically homeless. Project Hope offers a safe temporary refuge for those who live on the street or in places not fit for human habitation. Young adults, men, women, elderly and veterans are able to obtain food, clothing, access to a hot shower and a sense of community. The majority of those served experience a disabling condition such as a serious mental illness, substance abuse disorder or physical disability.

The Human Services Center

Staffed by a host of highly qualified professional counselors, the Human Services Center serves thousands of adults and young people in the course of a year. Included in the counseling services are individual, marital and family counseling, addiction counseling including alcoholism, co-dependency, eating disorders and sexual abuse. The center also serves as a meeting place for various therapy groups and several twelve-step programs.

The Sr. Jean Beagan, O.P. Family and Children's Center

The Family and Children's Center of Hope House Ministries is dedicated to the growth and development of children. It does this by enhancing the ability of parents to provide opportunities for children to live, love and work with a sense of mutual well-being.

Montfort Therapeutic Residence/Our Lady of Peace Academy

This program, which began in 2007, is an intensive therapeutic treatment facility for children ages 11-18 who find themselves caught in the family court system. These children come to us at a time of great crisis in their young lives and we provide them with a healthy, stable environment, a school program, individual counseling, group dynamics and educational and recreational outings. Its greatest gift is providing aftercare services when a young person returns home.

St. Louis de Montfort Academy

Montfort Academy is our free standing alternative junior-senior high school. Individualized instruction and private tutoring are provided by qualified teachers according to each student's needs. Montfort Academy's staff consists of a principal and volunteer teachers.

Wisdom House


A residence designated for long-term needs of both men and women, 21 years of age and older, who find themselves in a situation of crisis or homelessness and are in need of a semi-structured living environment. The goal of Wisdom House is to help the individual make a transition into a state of independent living.

Siena House

Siena House is a home for women and women with children, 21 years and older, who have suffered from domestic violence and/or are in crisis or transition. This program offers a safe, supportive environment while empowering women to move toward independent living and permanent housing.

St. Maximilian Kolbe Outpatient Addictions Treatment Center

The St. Maximilian Kolbe Outpatient Addictions Treatment Center provides comprehensive outpatient services for people motivated to enter and sustain recovery. Through individual and group counseling sessions, each day struggling addicts reclaim their lives.

This includes room, board, education, transportation, counseling services and more.




In Loving Memory of Matthew LoNigro



To My Dear Brother Matt,

It's been a month since you passed away. Father Frank had asked me to write a reflection about the friendship we formed while living at the house. Since it still feels surreal that vou are no longer here. I decided to write you a letter. My experience at Hope House and the brotherhood we shared are intertwined. I cannot think about one without the other.

When I first moved into Hope House, I never thought I would gain anything. I heard things like "turning my life around" and "getting a second chance," but those ideas were foreign to me. I just knew everything about how I was living my life needed to change. I never thought I would gain anything, especially a family, especially a brother like you.

I remember when Father Frank told me you were moving into the house. I knew your family because of their generosity to Hope House. When we first met, I was soft-spoken, quite unsure of myself, and did not like any attention. You were, well, the exact opposite of all of that. You were loud, seemed to know everyone, and a little rough around the edges. I remember you told your ridiculous stories that I was sure you were making up only to learn they were all true.

In some ways we were polar opposites. In other ways, we were exactly the same. We wanted to change, we wanted to grow, and we knew that we could not keep living the way we were before moving into the house. I was thinking of that dynamic, of how different we were. Father Frank had "asked" me to

show you around. Like I could say no. Due to the nature of how everything was set up, we went everywhere together. I think that was a difficult dynamic for both of us. I was painfully shy, you were not. I was younger than you, and you were used to doing what you wanted, when you wanted, and how you wanted. In the end, you were really good for me, and I was good for you. We really helped each other grow.

We figured it out pretty quickly. You were the first person I really connected with at the house. It still amazes me that you have such a big loving family and yet you always had time for me. You were also dealing with many different circumstances, but you always made me feel important in your life. Although I have shared that with you, I don't know if you knew how much that really meant to me. I will never forget that.

I was just telling some friends about the trip we took to Maryland when you returned there for a few months. During that time, we exchanged letters and when re-reading them, I can hear your voice. Even then, you were so kind and supportive while saying many things that will not be repeated.

In those letters, you also shared how important it was to be able to speak to your parents. You shared updates about Julie and were very hopeful about your future together. You weren't even married yet, and even then, Julie seemed like a saint. You always knew family was most important.

Those experiences during those amazing years at Hope House will always be a part of who I am. When you returned from Maryland, I was glad to have my friend back. It seemed like every day, we were learning and growing. We both knew it even then, how incredibly fortunate we were to have a second chance at life.

Matt, you taught me many things. You taught me not to take myself so seriously and helped me to be OK with who I am. You taught me what it meant to be your brother. Soon I began to look at you as an older brother. I wanted you to be proud of the man I was becoming.

You were there at so many pivotal points in my life. You stood by my side when I graduated from college and when my children were born. You were the obvious choice to be Liam's godfather. And I was honored when you and Julie asked me to be Abby's. You never let me forget how loved I was, especially when I was struggling.

For anybody that knew you, it's safe to say that you were given a second chance at life (and probably a lot more than that), and you never lost sight of what that meant. You made each moment count. Matt, I feel so grateful to be a part of your journey. To see you grow into the man that your parents always knew, Father Frank always knew, and Julie always knew.

You made the world a better place, Matt. You truly did. I remember spending time with you when Matthew was first born. You were so proud to be a father. That feeling only multiplied when Abby was born. You were honest with me about struggling with a work/life balance because you knew Julie deserved the very best of you. It was amazing to see

you as a father and as a husband. You would always say how proud you and Julie were of something Matthew and Abby were doing.

In some ways, you were larger than life. You would light up a room. You would say something so funny but completely inappropriate, and even though most people were thinking it, only you could get away with saying it.

I hope you know how much you mean to me. I know you knew, I just wish I had said it more. Your love and the love of your entire family has meant so much to me and so many others.

I am grateful we learned early on how important it is to have strong, healthy relationships. We knew a big part of our wellness was connection with others, helping others, and holding each other up. We also knew if it wasn't for Hope House, none of what we had would be possible.

I believe you did know how loved you are. The outpouring of love for you is actually amazing. Everyone has stories, very specific stories, of who you were to them and what you meant to them. You shared your gifts with all those around you, and we all feel the loss of you not being here.

I do know that your spirit and love will continue through Julie, Matthew, Abby, your amazing parents, siblings, nieces and nephews, god-children, Hope House family, friends, and all the people you meant so much to.





Montfort Therapeutic Residence

As a young child, I can recall going to India to visit my family's home. I remember seeing children, the same age as me, roaming the busy streets of Delhi, begging for money and food in the middle of the day. Being naïve, I asked my mother why they are not in school and where their families are. The answer I received was one that kept me up for

many nights, continuously imagining what daily life for those children must look and feel like. As I grew older, you can imagine my surprise and sadness when I learned that we also have many of these "forgotten" children here in the United States. While their stories and lifestyles may be very different from the children in India, their pain and loneliness are far too similar. At this time, I made a distinct promise to myself, that when I got older, no matter what profession I chose, I would do something to make a difference in the lives of these forgotten children. As it turned out, the social work profession became my pathway to this dream, and Hope House Ministries made it come true.

I am currently the Assistant Director of Montfort Therapeutic Residence (MTR), a ministry of Hope House Ministries. Montfort Therapeutic Residence is a 12-bed facility for court mandated, juvenile males ages 12-21. Many of the young men we serve have difficulties with anger, substance use, mental health, family relations, peer relations, and education. Many of these boys were raised by separated, divorced, or estranged parents; most of them come from families with disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds, who are often struggling to pay the bills and meet their children's needs; many of them have endured some form of abuse, whether it be physical, sexual, emotional, or verbal abuse; some of them have become involved with unhealthy peer groups or gangs; and many of them are having difficulties with their schoolwork or have given up on school altogether. Overall, all

of them have endured significant trauma at a young age and have developed unhealthy coping skills to help them adapt to their experiences of abandonment, abuse, mental health issues, parental substance use, displacement, and/or other forms of trauma.

While the rest of the world generally classifies these boys as "bad kids" and hopes to dismiss them from society, Montfort Therapeutic Residence knows they are worth more than that. MTR provides the tools necessary to aid and guide these young men to grow and create a better pathway for themselves. While at MTR, youth receive daily schooling, weekly individual and family therapy, and daily group therapy to address anger management, life skills, trauma, substance abuse, and the 12-steps. MTR also provides ongoing case management, medication management, and individualized educational services for these youth, as well as weekly parent group sessions to help parents or guardians gain the skills they need to better help and understand their children. MTR's program model is built upon the belief that with the right support, guidance, and care these youth can, and often do, succeed. Our goal is to reunite these children with their families as quickly as possible, and then continue to provide support for them within their communities, to ensure a safe and effective transition into adulthood.

My journey with Montfort Therapeutic Residence began in 2016 as a student intern. I will never forget the first day of my internship, when I learned the most important lesson of my social work career—the importance of human relationships. What sets Montfort Therapeutic Residence aside from other youth programs is our passion and desire to build real and meaningful relationships with the young men we serve. We genuinely care and are committed to the growth and wellbeing of these youth. Their wins are our wins; their losses are our losses. Through the trials and tribulations that come with self-growth, we become, what I call, "the MTR family" and create bonds and memories that last a lifetime. Above all, we strive to create a safe haven to help these youth feel valued and seen.


I often think about a young man who reported how he "lost his way" after being discharged from the MTR program. Now, he often calls the program and continues to keep in touch. He describes Montfort as the "lighthouse" that is always there to help him find his way in the depth of his darkness. Personally, I hope to keep that light shining for every "forgotten" child, and I thank Hope House Ministries for being the lighthouse for so many youth who have lost their way, and especially those who may not even know it yet.




