Job Title:

Nurse Practitioner for Homeless Individuals with Mental Health and Addiction Issues

Job Summary:

The Nurse Practitioner (NP) will work with homeless individuals who have mental health and addiction issues.

The NP will provide primary care, mental health services, and addiction treatment to clients in a shelter or other healthcare setting.

The NP will work collaboratively with other healthcare professionals, social workers, and case managers to provide comprehensive care.

Qualifications:

- Current licensure as a registered nurse in the state of practice.
- Certification as a Nurse Practitioner in psychiatric mental health.
- Master’s degree in nursing from an accredited institution.
- Experience providing care to individuals with mental health and addiction issues
- Knowledge of community resources for homeless individuals and mental health and addiction treatment.
- Strong communication, teamwork, and organizational skills.
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively with other healthcare providers and community agencies.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Conduct comprehensive assessments of clients' mental health, substance use, and medical histories.
- Develop treatment plans for clients which include medication management, counseling, and referrals to other specialists and community resources.
- Monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of treatment plans and medications.
 - Provide client education on health and wellness topics, including self-care techniques, medication management, and addiction prevention.
 - Document all services provided in a timely and accurate manner.
- Participate in team meetings and other staff meetings to discuss clients' progress and make recommendations for treatment adjustment.s
 - Provide crisis intervention services as needed.
 - Coordinate care with other healthcare providers and community agencies.
 - Contribute to the development of policies and procedures related to care of homeless individuals with mental health and addiction issues.
 - Keep up to date with the latest research and trends in mental health and addiction treatment.

Working Conditions:

The NP will work primarily in a shelter or other healthcare setting for homeless individuals. This can involve working with clients who have complex mental health and addiction issues, as well as with clients who have experienced trauma and other challenging life circumstances. The position may involve some evening and weekend work, as well as participation in on-call services.

Salary and Benefits:

The salary for this position varies depending on experience and location. Benefits may include health insurance, retirement, vacation and sick time, a 401K plan, and continuing education opportunities.
