



On March 15th, Hope House Ministries celebrated another successful Polar Plunge. For the second year in a row, I witnessed all the hard work, time, and energy put forth by the event organizer, Joel Posner, the Hope House staff, and the community as a whole. While many hands made that day what it was, it was Joel who secured the sponsors, got the permits, and pulled it together. So, when asked to reflect on what that day truly meant to me, the first word that came to mind was "Proud." That day was special, and all who participated should be proud and take a moment to reflect on the impact of such a day.

I have known Joel since I was a teenager. His transformation is nothing short of amazing. When I met Joel, he was carrying a great deal of hurt. As many of us who have traversed the halls of Hope House Ministries, Joel's family life and upbringing were interspersed with pain and affliction. This story echoes true for countless young men who seek refuge within the Hope House Community. I would love to say Joel came to HHM and flourished from day one, never looking back. But that is often not the case. Growth for all of us comes in stages. Our paths are often peppered with obstacles and setbacks. But I believe it is through this adversity that you reveal the true character of a person. It also allows us to see the goodness that exists in the world. As I have witnessed Joel's growth, I have grown to respect and admire him a great deal. He's not just my best friend but also my brother. He is a walking testament to the extraordinary effects Hope House Ministries has had on the lives of those it has touched. Through Hope House, he was given the tools and the blueprints to grow into the man God truly intended him to be. He went from a troubled teenager to a leader in our community. I couldn't be prouder of him.

It is important to recognize Joel's story is one of countless others. A book could and perhaps should be written on the scores of success stories that Hope House has produced as a result of the compassion and generosity of the community. As I looked around that day, I watched as several young men volunteered their time and participated to make the day a success. It didn't escape me

that these young men are writing their chapter in the story of Hope House Ministries. It is the story of Hope and Recovery.

I only wish those who donated and participated had a chance to know these stories better. I think if they did, they would understand the magnitude of their generosity's impact. For those who do not know, Hope House functions with 100% of its funding coming from private donations. When you understand this, only then can you begin to appreciate the love and compassion that exists within the surrounding community.

I was also proud of myself for opening my heart and choosing to give back what was freely given to me. I spent most of my early years taking and taking from the Ministry and not giving back. The reward was a feeling I can't begin to describe, but I think everyone involved with Hope House knows exactly what I felt. Every young man seeks the approval of his Father. To hear Father stand up there and say how proud he was of me touched my heart in such a way that I can't even begin to articulate. And the fact that my wife Adrienne was there to witness it added depth beyond measure. I don't have what most would consider a traditional family. Hope House is my family: Father Frank, Charlie Russo, Janet Brennan, and Mrs. Verruto, to name a few, are the ones I wanted to introduce my wife to as my family. The way they love and accept her touches my heart and only draws me closer to the Ministry.

So, for all who showed up, I thank you from the bottom of my heart. You are the unsung heroes in many tragic stories. Whether you donated \$50 or \$5000, please know you are part of our story. I implore you to pay close attention to the butterfly effect of these donations. Simply put, you save lives. And I am not only referring to the physical sense, but at a spiritual level, you are saving their souls from a darkness that is all too familiar to me and my Hope House Brotherhood. So once more, I thank you.





2025 - HOPE HOUSE 4X4X48 CHALLENGE RAISES OVER \$36,400!



The 5th Annual 48 Mile Run for Hope was held April 25-27th, 2025. The Run was organized & inspired by Ronan O'Brien & David Giaccone who completed the 4x4x48 in 2021 for the first time. The Challenge had participants running 4 miles every 4 hours for 48 hours. In 2022 six gentlemen completed 32 MILES! 2023

had 12 and 2024 had 15 Hope House alumni & residents step to the plate for the challenge. While this year we had 9 join in with others jumping in and out! Supporters made a per mile pledge with 100% of the proceeds funding alcohol & substance abuse treatment & many other human services provided by Hope House Ministries.

Founding Inspiration:

Ronan was first introduced to David Goggins via the internet and learned about his amazing journey of hardship, dedication, transformation, and inspiration. The power of his message is undeniable. We encourage everyone to look him up and read his book *Can't Hurt Me* — we were blown away. Some of the obstacles he overcame include an abusive childhood, a learning disability, racism, and obesity. He eventually became a decorated Navy Seal, extreme endurance athlete, top motivational speaker for pro-athletes and business moguls, and someone who has PERSONALLY raised millions for various charities.

He has inspired us to be super-vigilant in maintaining a healthy body, mind, and spirit. Part of that involves doing things that are uncomfortable and stepping outside of our comfort zones to discover what we are truly capable of. That is what this 4x4x48 Challenge represents for us and that is also what Hope House has meant for us. Though we are NOT endurance athletes by any stretch of the imagination, it was a monumental CHALLENGE no doubt, but for a great cause in Hope House Ministries to which we can personally attest to the MIRACLES they provide every day!

As David has noted and Father Frank touches on often in his homilies: "In a time when there is so much divisiveness, this event is a rare opportunity to come together with people all over the world for some amazing causes!"

As a family at Hope House Ministries, we feel blessed to continue serving individuals, families and children in need. As we create a **CHAIN OF HOPE**, please be assured that your generosity and compassion is a direct link to their paths of growth, healing and self-sufficiency.

Hope Academy

A long-term non-traditional residential treatment program for youth and young adult males who are homeless, experiencing mental health issues and living with addiction. This 50-bed facility is located on 5 acres of private space in Mt. Sinai. The program provides a compassionate approach to crisis intervention and a residential family style community comprised of professional clinical social workers, substance abuse counselors, psychiatric nurses, a career counselor, support staff and volunteers.

Matt's House

Matt's House is an aftercare program providing long term housing and supportive services for graduates of Hope Academy who are transitioning back to the community. The program provides supervision and structure for residents navigating a new life of sobriety.

Montfort Therapeutic Residence/Our Lady of Peace **Academy**

This program, which began in 2007, is an intensive therapeutic treatment facility for children ages 11-18 who find themselves caught in the family court system. These children come to us at a time of great crisis in their young lives and we provide them with a healthy, stable environment, a school program, individual counseling, group dynamics and educational and recreational outings. Its greatest gift is providing aftercare services when a voung person returns home.

St. Louis de Montfort Academy

Montfort Academy is our free standing alternative junior-senior high Individualized instruction and private tutoring are provided by qualified teachers according to each student's needs. Montfort Academy's staff consists of a principal and volunteer teachers.

Wisdom House

A residence designated for long-term needs of both men and women, 21 years of age and older, who find themselves in a situation of crisis or homelessness and are in need of a semi-structured living environment. The goal of Wisdom House is to help the individual make a transition into a state of independent living.

Siena House

Siena House is a home for women and women with children, 21 years and older, who have suffered from domestic violence and/or are in crisis or transition. This program offers a safe, supportive environment while empowering women to move toward independent living and permanent housing.

Pax Christi Hospitality Center

This twenty-five bed emergency center for men over 16, provides those in need on Long Island a compassionate, temporary residence offering three components: shelter and food, human needs and services, advocacy and networking.

Project Hope

Project Hope, under the aegis of the Pax Christi Hospitality Center, provides meals, clothing, hot showers and advocacy for those who are chronically homeless in the community. These men and women have often lived on the streets for years refusing traditional services. Project Hope staff and volunteers provide guests a safe and welcoming community of support and care.

St. Maximilian Kolbe **Outpatient Addictions Treatment Center**

The St. Maximilian Kolbe Outpatient Addictions Treatment Center provides comprehensive outpatient services for people motivated to enter and sustain recovery. Through individual and group counseling sessions, each day struggling addicts reclaim their lives.

The Human Services Center

Staffed by a host of highly qualified professional counselors serving hundreds of people from the community each month, the Human Services Center specializes in assisting those struggling with an array of issues including: substance abuse, anxiety, depression, parenting concerns, grief, bipolar depression, anger management, OCD, ADHD, abuse dynamics, codependency, chronic illness, self harm, housing insecurity, eating disorder, antisocial personality disorder and other addictions. Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and developmental disability to name a few. The Center also serves as a community meeting space for various therapy groups and 12-Step Fellowships.



Jubilee Pilgrimage to ROME & ASSISI



This summer's Jubilee pilgrimage to Rome and Assisi included 70 pilgrims. Rome's summer heat did not prevent the group from touring St. Peter's Basilica, St. Mary Majore (where Pope Francis is buried), St. Paul's Basilica, where Paul was beheaded for preaching the Gospel, and the first Basilica of Rome, St. John Lateran. One of the highlights of the trip was a chance to pray with Pope Leo at the Wednesday Papal Audience on June 4th. Pope Leo's message of Hope included a reflection on the Parable of the Laborers. Pope Leo explained that the owner of the Vineyard is the Lord, who searches for us throughout the day, and even at day's end. His reason for searching for us? Pope Leo assured us. "Because God loves our life." God is generous and will find us if we are willing to seek Him and wait for Him. Many thanks to the H.I.M.S. & Her who provided beautiful music at Mass throughout the week, and to 206 Tours for attending to details and bookings. Most of all, thanks to all of those who were able to make the Pilgrimage of Hope a special week.




